History

As historians we will...

- Study Greek life and achievements and their influence on the western world.
- Use documents, printed sources (e.g. archive materials) the Internet, databases, pictures, photographs, music, artefacts, historic buildings, visits to museums and galleries and visits to sites to collect evidence about the past.
- Ask, "What was it like for a... (child, rich person, etc...) during...
- Choose reliable sources of evidence to help me answer questions, realising that there is often not a single answer to historical questions.
- Choose the most appropriate way to present my information, which I realise is for an audience.



Maths

As mathematicians we will learn to...

- Read Roman numerals to 1000 and recognise years written in Roman numerals.
- solve number problems and practical problems linked to the place value of numbers.
- Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits, including using formal written methods.
- Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems.
- convert between different units of metric measure (e.g. kilometre and metre; centimetre and metre; centimetre and millimetre; gram and kilogram; litre and millilitre.
- measure and calculate the perimeter of composite rectilinear shapes in centimetres and metres.
- Identify 3-D shapes, including cubes and other cuboids, from 2-D representations.
- Recognise and cube numbers, and the notation cubed (³)
- Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a one- or two-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for two-digit numbers
- Read, write, order and compare numbers with up to three decimal places.
